#### CYBERSECURITY RISK & INCIDENT RESPONSE: A DISCUSSION WITH THE FBI'S PORTLAND NATIONAL SECURITY LEAD

Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC) George Chamberlin leads the National Security Branch for the FBI, Portland Field Office. The National Security Branch consists of the counterintelligence, counterterrorism and cyber programs. Prior to this role ASAC Chamberlin supervised the Cyber Program and established the Oregon Cyber Task Force for the Portland FBI. ASAC Chamberlin became an FBI Special Agent in 1999 and has served in a variety of positions during his twenty-year career, including National Threat manager for the FBI Cyber Division in Washington DC; Counterterrorism

Liaison to US Military Forces in Afghanistan; and FBI Assistant Legal Attaché in Australia, working joint international terrorism investigations with foreign law enforcement and intelligence service partners.

#### FROM STATIC DOCUMENTS TO STRATEGIC ASSETS: CONTRACT LIFECYCLE MANAGEMENT DATA, METRICS AND INSIGHTS

Legal departments are no strangers to the need to identify KPIs and metrics to measure performance and value contributed to the enterprise. While many departments have scorecards to measure outside counsel performance, manage internal staffing and make strategic decisions concerning litigation, contract processing metrics have been largely absent. The need to identify data and metrics that legal departments can collect to measure the speed and value of their contracting practices is growing. According to a 2018 Lexis Nexis survey, more than 40% legal departments are currently deploying CLM systems. In this session, attendees can optimize their current contracting processes and will benefit from:

- Identifying metrics related to their contracting processes including measuring contract velocity, risk mitigation, value added in cost savings or revenue created; and
- Developing a road map to translate their contracting data into insights that tells a data-driven story about the value of their contracting processes.
